Summer Reading Requirements:

All students are required to select from the list according to the grade level that they will be entering in the fall of 2010. Honors students will be required to read two books from the list. All other students will be required to read one from the list. Students will be assessed on their understanding of the required reading beginning the first day of class. The individual teacher will determine the kind of assessment. Students are strongly encouraged – but not required – to keep a reading log. Those students who complete a log may turn it in to their teacher for extra credit. The reading log, which may consist of selected quotations as well as notes on characters and plot details, should also include detailed responses to the essential questions (see *List of Summer Reading 2010-2011 Essential Questions*) for the titles they choose to read. The reading log and the essential questions will serve to refresh students' memories when they are asked to complete the assessment for summer reading. Students are also encouraged to have their books with them at the start of the school year as this will facilitate the recall of details for certain assessments.

AP Literature students are required to see Ms. Casey prior to the close of the 2009-2010 school year in order to receive their mandatory summer assignments.
